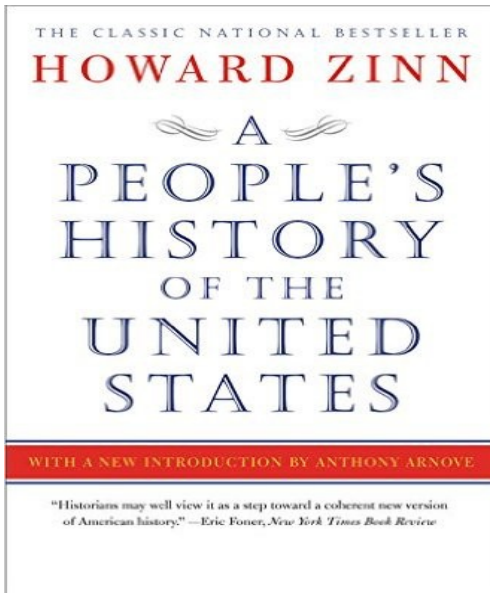


# Boulder Great Books Discussion Group

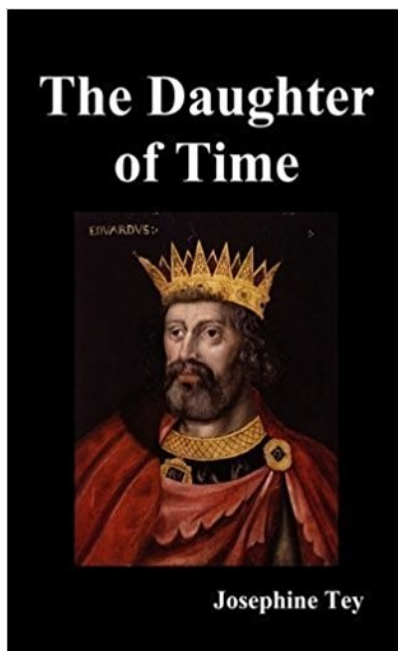
June 7, 2017 Selections from Howard Zinn,  
**A People's History of the United States**, and  
Richard Hofstadter, **The American Political Tradition**



Zinn chronicles American history from the bottom up, throwing out the official version of history taught in schools—with its emphasis on great men in high places—to focus on the street, the home, and the workplace. Hofstadter's classical approach balances Zinn, with his selection for this meeting focusing on Woodrow Wilson, Herbert Hoover, and Franklin Roosevelt. We pair these books for given meetings over the year so that selections cover the same time frames.

Or could Richard have been the victim, turned into a monster by the usurpers of England's throne?
