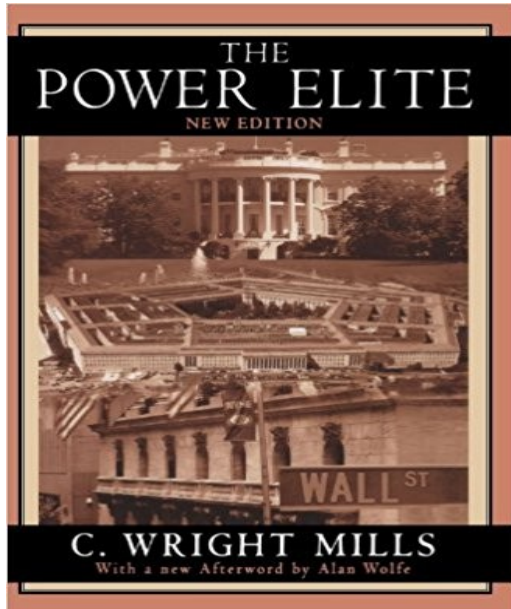


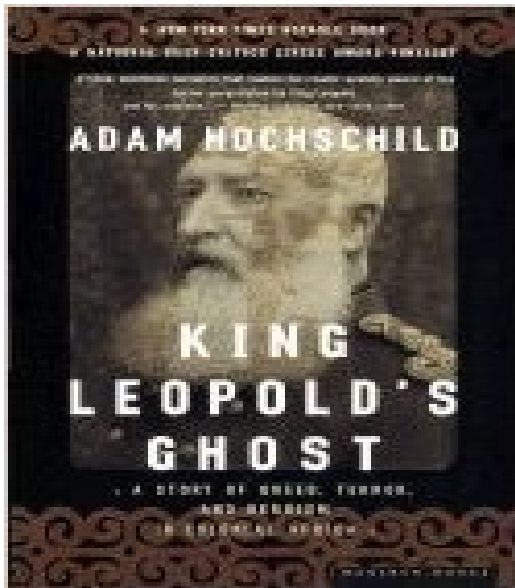

A contemporary classic of social science and social criticism. C. Wright Mills examines and critiques the organization of power in the United States, calling attention to three firmly interlocked prongs of power: the military, corporate, and political elite. First published in 1956, its underlying question of whether America is as democratic in practice as it is in theory continues to matter very much today.

June 6, 2018 Adam Hochschild, **King Leopold's Ghost: A Story of Greed, Terror, and Heroism in Colonial Africa**



A detailed historical account of the people who drove the genocide in the Congo and the individuals who dedicated their lives to stopping it. The book is incredibly gripping and Hochschild uses sources wisely to examine how the mass killings, slavery, and abuses took place in the Congo for so many years. King Leopold's mountain of lies continues to plague history today.
